Sparkling from Chile Miguel Torres

Miguel Torres Chile was founded in 1979 by the Torres family. The family had produced wines in Spain for more than 140 years and already owned vineyards for more than 300 years.

Miguel A. Torres decided to begin the Chilean project on the advice of Alejandro Parot, a Chilean friend and classmate from his studies in Dijon (France). After the search for a destination in America for the development of viticulture, the firm acquired a vineyard of 100 hectares close to the Andes mountain range and a small cellar near Curicó (city located 200 kms. South of Santiago).

The presence of extremely varied seasons and spectacular differences between the maximum and minimum temperatures which reach above 20°C due to the proximity of the Andes mountains with their perpetual snows and the climatic influence of the Humboldt Current played fundamental roles. These strong differences in day and night were ideal for the vineyard improving the capacity of the grapes to accumulate their best aromas. "It was an ideal place to produce unforgettable wines," is how Miguel A. Torres affirmed in the mid seventies that Chile was a paradise for viticulture.

Biddenden Vineyard

Biddenden Vineyard is Kent's oldest vineyard, having been established by the Barnes family in 1969 to produce wines. The vineyards are set in 22 acres on a gentle south facing slope in a shallow sheltered valley, 1.2 miles from the lovely Wealden village of Biddenden. Ten varieties of grapes are grown to produce White, Red, Rosé and Quality Sparkling wines.

Harvest of the grapes takes place in late September. Bottling of the wines commences early in the following year. Great effort is made to ensure that the Estate wines produced are of the highest quality, which is reflected by the number of awards they received.

The individuality of each grape variety and of each level of quality is respected. Certain vintages, judged insufficiently distinguished, are partly or wholly eliminated and sold off in bulk to other growers.

In 90 years, Spain had a reputation for producing excellent red wines and white wines but had no picture. With their experience of white wine winemaker, Jacques and François saw the untapped potential of the region of Rueda, with its arid soils and old vines. This land of emigrants, surrounded by mountains has a harsh climate and vines must struggle to get their food thoroughly. Wines, red and white, also have the same strong character were true Castilians!

Favoured by optimum weather and soil conditions, approximately eighty years ago the wine production began a full and accelerated development, especially in regions close to the Andes.

Domaine Francois Lurton - Present in Argentina since 1992 in order to produce a wine for the Argentine market, François is moving fast towards the exploitation. He creates in 1996 a bodega in the Uco Valley. The quality of the soil, a virgin land at a high altitude and the presence of water in the basement will seduce.

Argentina is the oldest country in the "New World". This is a country where wine is rooted in the traditions and where vines have existed for centuries. The wines produced here are François perfect reflection of this country: contrasting, colourful and very expressive.

Piedra Negra - Coming from the foothills of the Andes Cordillera consisting of volcanic rock. The Argentinians call this area "Piedra Negra" as sung by Mercedes Sosa. This bodega, being located precisely in this area, naturally bears this name.

Domaine Francois Lurton - "If I was a vine, I would choose to be planted in Chile." François Lurton is explaining his choice to develop wine in Chile in 1992.

This "dream land" for the development of red wines is the Colchagua Valley, where he bought a 200-hectare estate that had never produced wine before and it plants gradually.

The charm of this country so attractive reflect the wines François Lurton produces. Its ambition is to retain its Hacienda as a micro-winery focused on the high end with a limited supply.

The most expensive and prestigious wines in the world.
Bordeaux wine is made by 10,000 producers or chateaux from the grapes of 13,000 grape growers.
There are fifty-seven appellations of Bordeaux wine.

History of Bordeaux

In 1855, the merchants created a ranking to distinguish the finest Bordeaux wines. The classification still exists and is known as Grand Crus Classes.
At the end of the Second World War, Baron de Rothschild was the first wine maker to bottle his wines and mature them in a cellar, before all wine makers did the same.
And a most obvious trend these days is the high price of Bordeaux and the speculation around it.

A Bordeaux wine is any wine produced in the Bordeaux region of France. Average vintages produce over 700 million bottles of Bordeaux wine, ranging from large quantities of everyday table wine, to some of the most expensive and prestigious wines in the world. 89% of wine produced in Bordeaux is red (called "claret" in Britain), with notable sweet white wines such as Chateau d'Yquem, dry whites, and rosé all making up the remainder. Bordeaux wine is made by more than 8,500 producers or Chateaux. There are 60 appellations of Bordeaux wine.

The second wine starts in the vineyard. Management identify plots that produce good wine, but are never up to the standards for the grand vin. Wine from those parcels, which typically mature earlier, as well as selected barrels doesn't make the cut.

The blend for both is roughly equal parts Merlot and Cabernet Sauvignon. A little Petit Verdot goes into the grand vin as well.

Elsewhere, the wine is made and aged in the same way, regardless of its original plot. Winemakers taste each barrel, eliminating those not up to standard. Even some of first-string quality, but not in the style of the chateau, are excluded.
